


Advanced Search

You can select many kinds of limited terms.



A Search Terms

- Search Fields:

full-text, author, item title, abstract, caption

- Enter the search terms same as Basic Search.

AND, OR, NOT, ti, au, ca

To find certain words near each other in an article, enter each word in a separate box, then chose Near 5, 10, 25 from the drop-down list on the far right.

B Limited Search

- Type: You can limit four type of document.

Article, Review, Editorial, Pamphlet

- Date Range: To find an article published within a certain date range.

Enter the range of dates as 1939, 1939/05, 1939/05/01


- Article Language: To find an article in a certain language.

- Discipline(s) and/or Journal(s): To find an articles in specific journals or disciplines.

Use the checkboxes next to the discipline and/or Journal name, or enter a journal title in the box.

Citation Locator

This is convenient for the case you have already known a part of citation information.



- Fill in the fields you know.
- Leave unknown fields empty.
- Select the "Search" button.
- Journal title text box is new.

<Tips for Searching>

- AND Search

cat AND dog	cat && dog	cat & dog
+cat +dog	(cat dog)	cat dog

- OR Search

cat OR dog	cat dog
------------	------------

- NOT Search

cat NOT dog (= contain cat, not contain dog は含みません)
cat -dog

- Wildcards

Use a question mark (?) for one character or an asterisk(*) for multiple characters.

For example : te?ts tents, tests, texts

bird* bird, birding, birdman, birds

- Searching for Plural Terms

You can search for singular and plural forms of a word at the same time by adding an ampersand to the end of the singular form of a word

For example : cat&	cat, cats	box&	box, boxes
bus&	bus, busses	quiz&	quiz, quizzes
sky&	sky, skies	knife&	knife, knives

- Other Search Term

You can find words with spellings similar to your search term by using the tilde(~) symbol at the end of a search term.

For example : dostoyevsky~ dostoyevsky, dostoevsky, dostoievski, dostoevsky, dostoyevski,
dostoevskii, dostoevski

Use the tilde (~) with a numeral. For example, if you want to search for the terms debt and forgiveness and want only results with those words within ten words of each other, you would construct the following query: "debt forgiveness"~10.

- Stopwords

JSTOR search ignores the followings list of stopwords.

a, an, are, as, at, be, but, by, for, if, in, into, is, it, no, of, on, such, that, the, their, then, there, these, they, this, to, was, will, with

3. Search Results List

Modify Search

- "Modify Your Search"

You can modify your search when you want to change the way of searching or limit.

- "search within these results"

To search within an existing set of search results, check the "search within these results" box and enter a new search term in the text box (deleting any text already there). Then click the "search" button. The new query will be appended to the first with the AND operator. If the new term is entered with the operator NOT at the beginning, the original query and the "search within these results" query are joined with NOT.

Sorting

- Number of displayed results : 10, 25, 50, 100
- Sorting : Relevance, Newest to Oldest, Oldest to Newest
- You can select an exact page of search results.

Navigation for Citation

- Save Citations : You can save the citation in your MyJSTOR.
- Item Information : You can display article information.
- PDF : You can get the PDF for printing or downloading.
- Export this Citation : You can export citations into the citation software like EndNote.

Images

- Images in JSTOR : This tab presents results for search term matches in article image captions. If more than one term is searched, the search will use the OR operator.
- Images in ARTstor : This tab contains results from search term matches in ARTstor image metadata. The search is performed on the creator, title, and subject terms of the images. Separately subscribing is required to use services.

Four types of page navigation

Select a Page : You can select a page from thumbnail View.

Previous page : Easy next-page and previous navigation page.

Previous Item • Next Item : Navigation to next and previous article on the journal.

Back to Search Results : Jump to results page

Previous Result • Next Result : Navigation to next and previous search results.

Items by : Search the same author's items in Google Scholar.

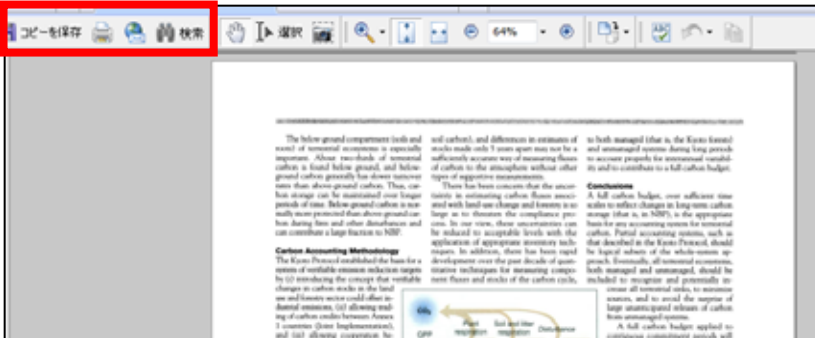
Access
